

Shepherd Schools In Person Learning, Health and Safety Plan 2022-2023

• In order to keep our schools open we ask...

Plan for in person learning to ensure all students have a safe, rigorous environment to learn.

Open with full capacity with limited activities and have precautionary measures in place and remote learning option in place.

School Year 2020-2021

Open with full capacity and full operations with remote learning only for those out with COVID and no long-term remote learning option.

School Year 2021-2022

Open with full capacity and full operations with no remote learning option.

School Year 2022-2023

Each option will have an emergency closure option built in.

2022-2023 School Year:

Guidelines to follow - the plan should consider the following:

- Procedures for cleaning, sanitizing, disinfecting spaces, surfaces, and any areas used by students and staff;
- Processes for monitoring students and staff for symptoms and history of exposure;
- Expectations for the posting of signs in highly visible locations that promote everyday protective measures, and how to stop the spread of germs;
- Procedures to offer mental health services and counseling for students and staff;
- Protocols for sporting activities consistent with local health department guidelines and MHSA.
- Schedules for training faculty and staff on the implementation of the Health and Safety Plan; and Systems for ensuring ongoing communication with families around the Health and Safety Plan.

Health/Safety – Social Distancing

Masks will be OPTIONAL for staff and students

• Signs/Markings

 Entrances and other highly visual areas will have that promote everyday protective measures, and how to stop the spread of germs

Visitors/Volunteers

✓ Visitors and volunteers will be allowed in the schools and will be reminded of the importance of staying home if ill.

Health/Safety – Social Distancing

Recess (groups, equipment)

- \checkmark Students will be able to sanitize after each recess.
- ✓ Additional recess areas added to allow for student spacing.

Classroom Seating

- ✓ Classrooms will be equipped with cleaning supplies to wipe high traffic areas throughout the day.
- \checkmark Seating charts will be kept for each class or class period.

Health/Safety – Hygiene

Hand Sanitizer

✓ Staff and students will be asked to use hand sanitizer each time they enter a building or a classroom.

Handwashing

✓ We will allow more opportunities for students to be able to wash their hands during the day prior to breakfast, lunch and snack times as well as after recess.

• Ventilation

 Improved ventilation systems will be added in needed areas.

Health/Safety – Hygiene

• Disinfecting Towels – wiping off desks

- ✓ Grades K-2 will be able to wipe of their desks whenever the teacher has a transition time where students are coming and going.
- Grades 3-12 will be able to wipe off their desks after using the desk/area. We will supply wipes but will be asking families for help to supply more if they can.
- ✓ A wipe can be used as long as it is still wet. Once they are starting to dry they need to be thrown out.

Health/Safety – Hygiene

- Temperatures
 - ✓ AS NEEDED, THE NURSE WILL CHECK STUDENT TEMPERATURES AND IF THEY ARE ABOUT 100.4, THEN PARENTS WILL BE CALLED AND REQUIRED TO COME AND PICK UP THEIR CHILD - this is a standard way we operate even prior to COVID.
 - We will be asking families to personally monitor their health.
 More than ever we need families and staff to help us by choosing to do the right thing by staying home when they are sick.

Health/Safety – Food Service

• Breakfast

✓ Elementary will pick up their breakfasts and will be eating breakfast in their classrooms.

✓ MS/HS will pick up a breakfasts at designated spots and then can take it to their 1st period to eat.

• Lunch

✓ Students will all eat in the cafeteria or other designated areas during their scheduled times. Tables will be sanitized between each group.

✓ Additional seating added to outside areas to allow for spacing.

Counseling Staff -

- Each school has a school counselor that will be • checking in with the students and staff to monitor and offer mental health services and counseling as needed. There are higher risks for anxiety and depression as well other issues our students have been faced with during remote learning as well as when we are returning to school so services will be offered accordingly.
- Most all Elementary, Middle School and High School staff are trained in suicide prevention.

Sports Guidelines

- We will start all practices on time for each seasons unless restrictions are required by MHSA.
- We continue to use the camera systems in our HS and MS gyms and football field so that family members can watch from home.
- Participation of sports you have to attend school in order to participate in sports per our normal District Policies (excludes homeschool participation in extra-circular).

Academic Impact

- Tutoring High School
 - Students with low achievement scores on MAP testing will be offered after school or summer school tutoring.
 - Tutoring will be available for ACT Prep.
 - **Middle School**
 - Students with low achievement scores on MAP testing will be offered after school or summer school tutoring.
 - Elementary
 - Students with low achievement scores on MAP or progress monitoring will be offered after school or summer school tutoring.
- A credit recovery program and intervention program will be available for use in the elementary, middle school and high school.
