

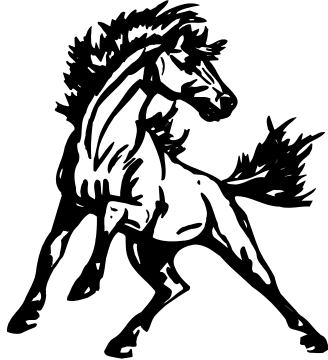

Criterion Reference Test measures progress towards meeting state standards in Science. Shepherd High School was a pilot school for this test taken in the spring of 2003. The sophomores will be taking this test again in March. This test will compare our students' achievement on the State of Montana's standards.

SBAC is administered to Junior's in relation to Math & English Language Arts and the Common Core Standards.

PSAT is administered to juniors interested in furthering their education.

ASVAB is a vocational assessment for juniors administered by the military.

ACT PLAN TEST is a career assessment test given to sophomore students.

MAPS Assessments is a comprehensive assessment aligned with the Montana state standards and benchmarks. The results give us information on mastered skills and help us to place students in classes where they can get the extra help needed to be successful in high school.

AR & Star Assessments is an outstanding program designed to meet the students reading development of where they are and help them progress.
