**NWEA MAPS Assessments**-MAPS TESTING is a comprehensive assessment aligned with the Montana state standards and bench MontCas will be given to only 8th graders in the area of Science.

**SBAC** is administered to marks. The results give us information on mastered skills and help us to place students in classes where they an get the extra help needed to be successful in high school.
