

Assessments Used at Shepherd Middle School

Criterion Reference Test (Montana's CRT): This assessment is administered to students in grades 4, 8, and 10. The assessment covers science. The CRT compares student achievement to Montana Content Standards. The data from this test determines whether or not we are meeting the requirements for Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

Star Reading is a norm referenced assessment that helps schools match instruction to individual student's skill levels and measures growth throughout the year. It is administered three times a year—beginning, midyear, and end of the year.

Star Math is a norm referenced assessment that helps schools match instruction to individual student's skill levels and measures growth throughout the year. It is administered three times a year, beginning, midyear, and end of the year.

NWEA Measures of Academic Progress: (MAP): These computerized adaptive assessments are administered two to three times per year. Reading, language, math, and science tests are available. The formative assessments are aligned to state standards and are used to measure a student's growth or progress in school. The scale used to measure a child's progress is called the RIT scale.

SBAC: This assessment is administered to grades 3-6. It is based on Common Core Standards and is used to determine proficiency.

Middle School Goals

80% of all students will meet proficient or advanced in Science, Math and Reading skills, as measured by the MontCas Assessments and SBAC.
