Shepherd School District's Curriculum Plan has been a part of the Shepherd process for reviewing curriculum, instructional materials and resources for a number of years. We have had an evaluation process within our curriculum review in place for many years to ensure teachers are providing a quality education with quality materials.

Shepherd Schools have been a member of the Alliance for Curriculum Enhancement (ACE) for over 15 years. The mission of ACE is to "develop and provide meaningful professional learning, curriculum, and relevant resources to build educators' capacity to support students in achieving proficiency."

ACE provides Shepherd Schools with support in curriculum development, professional development, mentoring and coaching in various aspects of teaching and learning, as well as guidance in proficiency-based education. Their proficiency-based support focuses on instructional practices and standards-based grading.

Along with curriculum work from ACE, Shepherd has a curriculum review process of its own in place to review curriculum and materials in an ongoing rotation in order to make sure we have the most up to date materials.

A well-developed curriculum ensures that there is a logical progression from one grade to the next and across different subjects. Teachers can build on what students have already learned, reinforcing concepts and skills in different contexts. We meet as subject area teams throughout the year in our vertical alignment meetings in order to establish this progression.

Having a curriculum plan allows for targeted professional development. Shepherd teachers can receive training on the curriculum and how to teach it effectively, ensuring that they are equipped with the knowledge and strategies needed to help students achieve growth.

Evaluation of Curriculum to ensure the inclusion of the distinct and unique cultural heritages and contemporary portrayal of American Indians

IEFA event for Science Teachers, Feb 2025: In professional development through ACE, teachers learn about standards-based classrooms in training because it provides a clear framework for aligning their instruction, assessments, and curriculum with established learning goals, ensuring all students are being taught the necessary skills and knowledge at

their grade level, promoting consistency across the school, and allowing for better tracking of student progress and accountability for learning outcomes. The MT state standards are the minimum and our teachers are trained to provide instruction that take their students to even higher levels beyond the standards.

Proficiency-Based Learning

Our district is a part of the Alliance for Curriculum Enhancement (ACE) curriculum consortium. ACE regularly brings teachers together to create examples of bundling the MT Content Standards for each grade level and content area to ensure that all standards are explicitly taught and assessed. Proficiency-based learning allows for more individualized pacing. Students tailor their learning to meet their own individual needs. This reduces the “one-size-fits-all” approach. This allows students to understand their strengths and areas for improvement. Students are expected to demonstrate a range of skills, including critical thinking, problem-solving, and application of knowledge, which are more important in real-world situations. Proficiency-based learning is more

of a student-centered approach to education, helping to better prepare students for life after school, whether in further education, the workforce, or other areas of personal development. Shepherd concentrates on personal growth of each student as an individual rather than just hitting a number or grade.

Shepherd Curriculum Review Schedule

Shepherd Schools has its own review cycle of curriculum materials and programs used within our K-12 system. This cycle allows us to set goals and then collect data on current programs. Needs of our students are ever-changing and therefore a review of our curriculum is necessary to make sure we are providing the best educational opportunities to the current students while looking towards the future.

Shepherd reviews its curriculum to ensure that the content being taught is up-to-date, relevant, and aligned with current educational standards both at the national and at the state levels. We also review our curriculum to make sure we include the unique and distinct cultural heritages of American Indians to meet the needs of all students.

Regular reviews of the curriculum allow schools to identify gaps in knowledge or skills that students might be lacking, making it possible to adjust teaching materials and strategies for better student performance and learning outcomes. This is done every year in vertical alignment meetings that take place in all subject areas K-12 in our district. Each vertical team meeting covers the standards being taught and which are the priorities for the grade level and subject. This ensures our curriculum is balanced and the teachers from grade level to grade level have a plan in place for the curriculum they teach.
