SECTION 504

Section 504 is an Act which prohibits discrimination against persons with a handicap in a program receiving Federal financial assistance. The Act defines a person with a handicap as anyone who:

- has a mental or physical impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities (major life activities include activities such as caring for one's self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning and working);
- 2) has a record of such an impairment; or
- 3) is regarded as having such an impairment.

The school district has specific responsibilities under the Act, which include the responsibility to identify, evaluate, and if the child is determined to be eligible under Section 504, to afford access to appropriate educational services.

If the parent/guardian disagrees with the determination made by the professional staff of the school district, he/she has a right to a hearing with an impartial hearing officer.

Reporting STUDENT ABSENCES

House Bill #358

Recommended procedures to follow in reporting absentees at Shepherd Elementary, Junior High and High Schools:

- 1. Parents should make an attempt to notify the school by a note, in advance, when they know their child will not be in school the next day.
- 2. Parents of children who are absent should call the school by 9:30 a.m. to report that their child will be absent that day. If parents have not called by 9:30 a.m., school authorities will make an attempt to contact the parents. The date and time the call is made will be documented. Parents will be contacted regardless of child's age.

TITLE IX

No person in Shepherd Public School shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any education program or activity. The Title IX Coordinator is Heather Ekness.

To the Parents/Guardians of students in the Shepherd Public Schools: This is to notify you that the Board's policy concerning the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, Public Law 930380, is available in the office of the school. You have a right to inspect and review those portions of your students' educational record as stated in policy during regular hours.

SHEPHERD SCHOOLS TITLE I PARENTAL RIGHT-TO-KNOW

Your Right to Know - Professional Qualification of Teachers

Parents of children, who attend schools that receive Title I, Part A funding, have the right to request and receive information about the qualifications of the educators who teach their children core subjects - reading, English language, arts and mathematics. The same applies to paraprofessionals who instruct.

At a minimum, the information you receive must explain these 3 essential components of an educator's

At a minimum, the information you receive must explain these 3 essential components of an educator's qualifications.

- 1. Whether or not the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject(s) he or she is teaching,
- 2. Whether or not the teacher has an emergency or conditional certificate by which state qualifications were waived,
- 3. What undergraduate and graduate degree (s) the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentrations.

NOTIFICATION IF YOUR CHILD'S TEACHER IS NOT HIGHLY QUALIFIED

ESEA directs schools to send timely notice to parents and guardians IF their child has been assigned to, or taught for more than four consecutive weeks by a teacher of a core academic subject, who is not highly qualified.

ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION TO PARENTS, STUDENTS, AND EMPLOYEES OF THE SHEPHERD SCHOOL DISTRICT

(Pursuant to the AHERA Rule, 40 C.F.R. §§ 763.84(d)

Asbestos is a naturally-occurring mineral which has, until about 1980, been commonly used in building materials. Asbestos will not burn, is an excellent insulator, has great strength, is resistant to chemicals, and absorbs sound. Examples of asbestos-containing building material (ACBM) are vinyl floor tile, sprayed-on acoustical ceiling material, and pipe insulation. As ACBM deteriorates over time, or is disturbed by maintenance, renovation, or demolition activities, asbestos fibers may be released into the air. Inhalation of these airborne, microscopic fibers has been proven to cause such deadly diseases as lung cancer, mesothelioma (cancer of the lining of the lungs), and asbestosis (scarring of lung tissues). Uncontrolled asbestos contamination in buildings has been, and remains, a significant environmental and public health issue. In 1986, Congress enacted the *Asbestos Emergency Response Act (AHERA)* to require public and private, secondary and elementary schools to identify ACBM in their school buildings and take appropriate actions to control the release of asbestos fibers. In 1987, the US Environmental Protection Agency finalized a regulatory program which enforces the *AHERA* mandate. These regulations are incorporated within the *AHERA Rule (40* C.F,R. Part 763, Subpart E).

In compliance with the AHERA Rule, the Shepherd School/School District had its school building(s) inspected by an asbestos inspector, accredited by the State of Montana. During that inspection, areas of suspect ACBM were identified. The type, condition, and location of this ACBM was noted, Samples were taken of some or all of the suspect ACBM. Laboratory analysis of these samples confirmed the presence or absence of ACBM. Suspect ACBM not sampled and analyzed were assumed to contain asbestos. Confirmed and/or assumed ACBM currently remain in certain locations in our school building (s).

Upon confirmation of the presence of ACBM, an Asbestos Management Plan was developed for each of the school buildings in the School/ School District by an asbestos management planner, accredited by the State of Montana. The Asbestos Management Plan (s) include a description of the measures currently being taken to ensure that the ACBM remaining in our school building (s) is maintained in a condition that will not pose a threat to the health of our students and employees. The Plan (s) describe past response actions taken to abate ACBM, as well as response actions planned for the future. Information is provided on the periodical monitoring of the condition of ACBM remaining in our school building (s) through triennial reinspections, conducted by accredited asbestos inspectors, and through semiannual surveillance, conducted by trained school maintenance staff. Finally, the asbestos awareness training program for maintenance and custodial personnel is documented.

A copy/copies of the Asbestos Management Plan (s) is/are available at School/School District administrative office during regular office hours. the Superintendent is the designated Asbestos Program Coordinator for the School/School district. Please direct all inquiries regarding the Asbestos Management Plan(s) to him/her at 373-5461.

SEXUAL HARASSENT/INTIMIDATION STATEMENT

The Shepherd Public School is committed to a positive and productive working and learning environment free from discrimination. Discrimination adversely affects morale and interferes with employee and student ability to work and learn.

The District prohibits sexual harassment or intimidation of its employees or students, whether committed by a co-worker, supervisor, subordinate, contractor, volunteer, or student, and finds such behavior just cause for disciplinary action. The District will not tolerate such behavior between members of the same or opposite sex. The District will take prompt, effective and remedial action on complaints, grievances, and reports of sexual harassment or intimidations (including informal reports of inappropriate sexual or gender-directed conduct) which come to the attention of the District.

The District prohibits retaliation against any employee or student because he/she has made a report of alleged sexual harassment, or against any employee or student who has testified, assisted, or participated in the investigation of a report. Retaliation is itself a violation of federal and state regulation prohibiting discrimination and will lead to disciplinary action against the offender.

This policy applies to individuals attending any events on District property, whether or not District-sponsored, and to any school-sponsored events, regardless of locations.

A substantiated charge against a student shall subject that student to student disciplinary action including suspension or expulsion, consistent with the District's student discipline policy.

I look forward to a fantastic year with terrific students, parents, staff, and community! Enjoy the remaining weeks, relax a little more, and we'll see you soon!



Transportation Newsletter 2023-2024

I hope everyone had a great summer!!!

The start of school is just a few weeks away and all the bus drivers are excited to see everyone again!!

At this time, we will be starting the year with 8 routes instead of the usual 9. Bus 1 will remain offline and stops will be filtered to buses 5 & 8. Additional adjustment has been made to buses 2,4 & 7 to compensate for the increased rider head count on all routes.

Normally, before the start of school, students will receive a notice from the schools, with their bus route numbers and approximate stop times included.

Please take a very close look this year as we had to make many changes to accommodate growth and balancing between the routes.

Some stop location changes will affect the Equestrian subdivision and also the stop at the Peaceful Plateau turn around.

Equestrian subdivision stops will now be on bus 2 and the stop location has been moved to the intersection of Shepherd Rd & Equestrian.

Peaceful Plateau turn around stop will remain on Bus 7 but the stop location has been moved to the intersection of CA Rd & Peaceful Plateau trail.

Both of these areas/stops do not have enough area in their locations for the buses to easily turn around without backing so they are being moved.

If you have a child that is now driving or otherwise no longer needing bus transportation, please call or email me so that we can adjust the roster.

Seating continues to be at a premium on all routes and we will not be able to "save" seats for inclement weather etc.

We transport over 500 students each day and some of the buses run close to full, so your help in this matter is appreciated.

As in the past, you can register your child for an AM route and a different PM route. We cannot assign routes by day (ex- Bus X on Mon, Tue, Wed and Bus Y Thurs/Fri).

The arrival time to school is 08:00 AM and we will be adjusting routes/ times the 1st few weeks of school to make the routes arrive as close to 08:00 AM as possible.

Minor time changes after the start of school will be communicated by the drivers to the students.

Any route changes will be communicated by the schools or Transportation office.

Elementary Parents:

All elementary riders will be assigned and issued an RFID scan card to scan in when entering the bus. This will allow us to quickly identify where every rider is and locate them much quicker than in the past. Also, please make sure your child knows their full name, before school starts. It sounds like a small thing but the 1st couple of weeks it is invaluable to us in insuring each child is where they are supposed to be.

Every day we have every kind of clothing, books, lunch boxes, trapper keepers etc left on the buses. Please write your child's name on everything possible so we can quickly get their things back to them.

If they come home missing a coat, jacket or whatever, the drivers place these items on the buses dash for a couple of days before sending to the elementary lost and found.

Finally, when you receive the parent / student transportation handbook, <u>PLEASE</u> review it with your child, especially the section on electronic devices.

Cell phones, I-Pads, Laptops etc, need to remain in backpacks and otherwise out of sight.

We will <u>not</u> be giving warnings for electronics violations, so please insure your child understands the expectation and does not use electronics while on the bus.

The handbook has the basic rules and expectations for all riders to maintain the privilege of riding the bus and we need everyone to follow them.

The process for notifying parents of any transportation rules issues is changing. Previously we sent home a ticket with the child for the parent to review/sign and a follow up phone call if there was a suspension looming. We will be using a new system where the driver will issue tickets electronically and sent to the Transportation Director. I will then review and email the form to the parent for their review/follow up and a phone discussion for any suspensions or continuing issues. We are hoping to reduce the amount of paperwork and eliminate ticket loss while improving communication.


